Renaming of the Teacher Excellence Award in Honor of Gail Neumann



Gail Neumann lived a life full of love and service. She served on the Vista Board for several years. In 2017 the Vista Foundation was organized with Gail as a founding member along with Vista's Director, Sam Gibbs. Her commitment to education and educators throughout our community was an inspiration. She tenaciously sought ways to enrich and enhance opportunities for children everywhere. A focus for Gail, with regard to the Vista Foundation, was to recognize teachers who created rigorous, meaningful experiences for students on a daily basis. She proposed an award to honor these incredible educators. This award became known as the "Vista Foundation Teacher

Excellence Award". Each year the employees at Vista have the opportunity to nominate one teacher to win this \$500 award. Gail was instrumental in the selection process for the past two years as tremendously dedicated teachers were chosen as recipients.

Gail lived a passionate life, loving her family, enjoying travel, and serving her community. The Vista Foundation was very saddened to learn of her passing on April 7, 2020. During the Vista Foundation Meeting in September 2020, it was unanimously approved to rename the Vista Foundation Teacher Excellence Award to the Gail Neumann Teacher Excellence Award.





the VEX Robotics Competition program at Vista for the 2020 - 2021 "Change Up" season. Each year teams of 4-5 students design, build, and program a competitive robot to compete in an engineering challenge that tests the students and drives them to excel. This year, our 10 VRC teams competed in three local tournaments against teams from all over the state of Utah. Nine of our ten teams were invited to State championship tournaments and two of our middle school teams qualified for the world championships. We are currently making plans to attend a special showcase tournament held at Lagoon Amusement Park in June. This season, our teams were presented 17 awards including tournament champion, judges, design, sportsmanship, and the most prestigious, excellence award.
